## ***Mite Tornadoes Fall 5-4 to SJHA Admirals Red in a Thriller at Kent Valley Ice Centre***

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 21 November, 2009** –The Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes hosted the Seattle Junior Hockey Admirals Red in a battle between the number 1 and 2 teams in the NPSHL Mite Division. What resulted was a close, well played game with the Admirals Red earning a 5-4 victory. The Tornadoes took more shots and had more time in the offensive zone, but the Red Admirals worked an effective counter attack to nip the Tornadoes in the end.

The teams were deadlocked at 1-1 after the first period, with Oliver Carlson getting the Tornados off to a quick start, scoring at 1:51. The Red Admirals clamped down in the defensive zone, however, and kept the game close until netting the equalizer at 5:08.

The second period was dominated by the Tornado offense – generating 10 shots on-goal to the Red Admirals 4, but like the first period both teams were only able to light the lamp one time. Playing more than 12 minutes of scoreless, thrust and parry hockey, Danny Smith scored at 12:03 on a breakaway. Danny showed great patience as the Red Admiral goaltender displayed some fine positioning to force Danny wide of the net. Danny remained calm and focused, however, and worked the puck back to the crease, sneaking it past the goal post. The Red Admirals countered 1 minute later as Joe Kennedy was able to beat Tornado goalie Brett Jenkins on a breakaway.

With the score knotted at 2 after 2 the third period promised to be exciting. The teams did not disappoint. Danny Smith netted his second goal of the game at 6:41 of the third to put the Tornados up 3-2. However, as was the trend in this game, the Red Admirals scored 30 seconds later to tie the score back up.

The Red Admirals – whose offense was more geared to open ice, individual effort, scored quickly after the ensuing face off, as Ashton Blackwell threw a puck in the direction of the Tornado goal which was deflected past Jenkins. Oliver Carlson got the goal back quickly on a rush down the right side to equalize at 9:43.

The game appeared to be heading for a 4-4 tie, but the Red Admirals were able to create a scoring chance and won a scrum in the crease, with Joe Kennedy netting his second goal of the game and earning the game winning goal with 1:01 left in the game. The Tornados worked hard in the last minute to try and earn the tie, but were thwarted by the collapsing Red Admiral defense. The two teams play again on January 24 in what should be another great match up!

The Tornados enter the Thanksgiving Day weekend – and first off weekend of the season – with a 6-1 record. The team is tied for first in points (19), have earned all of their sportsmanship points (6), and lead the league in goals and goals against. More notable, however, is their growth as a team. With six practice sessions before the next game, you can be sure the Tornado coaches will continue their great work, with a continued focus on skating hard, using the boards to clear the defensive zone, filling the lanes on offense and passing the puck to the open man.

At this time of thanks – suffice to say we are all thankful for the great effort our boys are displaying, the tremendous coaching they are getting, and for getting to watch such good, competitive hockey each weekend.
