Kent, WA 15 March, 2009 – The Kent Valley Squirt Tier-II Selects had a fantastic tournament at Puget Sound Hockey Center in Tacoma March 13th, 14th, and 15th. Following is a game by game summary:

Game 1: Kent Valley Selects (4) vs. Spokane Jr. Chiefs (2) – Spokane came out with great spirit and intensity but failed to intimidate the Kent Valley Selects. The Selects got on the scoreboard first and were all over the Chiefs, winning races to loose pucks and generally outworking the Chiefs all over the ice. Nicholas Snyder scored 3 goals with help from his teammates as the team played with confidence. Spokane played catch-up in the 3rd period scoring two goals, but failed to catch the high flying Selects. Defenseman Nicky Poker scored the Selects' 4th goal, a terrific goal, pinching on the side boards to keep the puck in the zone and then making a nice move to beat a defender and score up high.

Game 2: Kent Valley Selects (5) vs. Puget Sound Tomahawks (3) – The Selects got three goals early against the Puget Sound Tomahawks and never looked back. The Selects, playing their second game of the day against a fresh Puget Sound team, proved that conditioning pays off. The Tomahawks put a bit of a scare into the Selects with pressure in the third period, but the Selects' off-ice conditioning and many hours of skating in practices kept them strong and enabled them to hold on for the win. It was a gratifying win for the Selects who had played even with the Tomahawks throughout the season.

Game 3: Kent Valley Selects (1) vs. Spokane Jr. Chiefs (0) – Game three was the best game of the tournament for the Selects. They won the game by a very close score of 1 to 0. It was truly a goaltender's game as both made many unbelievable stops. The Selects' Cam Hansen played like a man possessed and held Spokane scoreless, turning back many close range scoring chances with great save after sprawling stop. The Kent Valley defense played particularly well with Dawson Meyers, Elliot Plourde, Connor Pitlick and Nick Poker shutting down Spokane's top line. Mikey Thomas got the game-winning goal with an assist from Dylan Moriarty.

Game 4: Kent Valley Selects (2) vs. Puget Sound Tomahawks (4) – Game four was the Selects' chance to knock out Puget Sound and the Kent Valley boys were hungry for it. Ironically, they might have had a better go in the final, many observers said, if they had sandbagged and let Tacoma win. That would have put them in the final, but we played it straight and went for the win. Nick Snyder was looking for goal #50, and had some good chances, but the puck seemed unwilling to go in for him. Nonetheless, our team offense was the best of the year, because while we have relied on scoring from Nick all year, we scored 5 goals in the game, all from players other than Nick. Thanks to a rash of penalties on Tacoma, who couldn't keep up with our speed and team play, we had the advantage and controlled all the way.

Game 5: FINAL Kent Valley Selects (1) vs. Spokane Jr. Chiefs (5) – The Kent Valley boys were excited to be in the final, and everyone was upbeat and positive in the pre-game warm-up. But, the Selects just came out a bit flat. Spokane got off to a great start and after going up 4 to 0, never looked back. Mikey Thomas, who scored 4 goals in the tournament, got the Selects on the board, but it was too little too late.

Tournament Summary: On the whole, it was kind of hard for the Selects to beat Spokane twice, sweep the round-robin 4-0, and then lose the "championship" to a team they'd already beaten twice and a team who finished the weekend 2-3 while the Selects went 4-1. For a bunch of 8, 9, and 10-year olds to sustain such a high level of play for that fifth game proved to be just too much. Looking back to the start of the season when the Selects travelled down to Portland and got hammered 21 to 4 over two games, the boys worked

hard all season, stayed positive, and with a focus on skill development, conditioning, and small area games, improved dramatically.

Editor's Note - A parent of one of the Kent Valley Selects reported the following: *"In game two, against the Puget Sound Tomahawks, Nicklas VanHalder tipped in an Elliot Plourde shot from the point that went in top shelf for the score. It was the kind of tip that had it been the NHL it would have made the evening's highlight reel. It was a fantastic tip by VanHalder. It wasn't the game winner or anything like that; it was just a beautiful and memorable goal."*

Kent Valley Pee Wee "B" Storm Compete at PNAHA State Tournament

Kirkland, WA 15 March, 2009 – The KVHA Storm PeeWee B team went to the PNAHA B State tournament last weekend, to compete against other B and Tier-II teams for the state championship. The Kent Valley boys played hard, but lost all four games in round robin play, eliminating them from the playoffs.

Game 1 was against the SJHA Admirals B team at the Kingsgate Ice Arena. The ice was dressed beautifully and was fast. The Admirals came out fast and tough, scoring 6 goals on the Storm, while earning 24 penalty minutes. AJ Alonzo and Nick Pizzey each scored a goal for the Storm, while the team took a total of 6 penalty minutes. Final score: SJHA 6, Kent 2. Shots on goal were 40 for Seattle, and 10 for Kent.

Game 2 was played at Castle Ice against the Whatcom Warriors. This was a game that stayed close through 2 periods of hockey, and then came unglued in the 3rd period. The score was 3-2, Whatcom, going into the 3rd, when a penalty against AJ Alonzo turned into a game misconduct and ejection. With AJ out, and the Storm already down three players, including two D, the Warriors went on to score 4 unanswered goals. To illustrate how penalties can affect the outcome of a game, the Storm had 3 shots in period 1, and 11 in period 2. Clearly, Kent was gaining control of the game. Whatcom had 14 shots in the 1st, and 15 in the 2nd, but goalie Aaron Mathews had allowed only 3 goals. In the 3rd period, Kent was assessed 22 minutes in penalties, including AJ's ejection. Whatcom managed 14 3rd period shots, while Kent got off only 1. This was clearly the difference in this game. Final score: Whatcom 7, Kent 2. Shots on goal were 43 for Whatcom, while Kent had 15. AJ and Matt Saunders scored the Kent goals, both in the 2nd period.

Game 3 was to become a penalty filled, shot fest for the Kent team. Facing the SJHA Admirals again, to say this game was out of control would be an understatement. The referees had their hands full for 45 minutes of hockey, with hard hits going both ways. Seattle fired 63 shots on goalie Aaron Mathews, while Kent got off only 6 against Seattle's Josiah Cannon. Cannon was caught sleeping in the 2nd period, when a low shot by Hayden Milne slipped under him for Kent's lone goal of the game. Seattle managed to score 8 times, but 2 of these goals were knocked in by our players, and from the scorekeeper's box, it became obvious that the SJHA shooters were getting frustrated with Kent's goaltending, as they ran him no less than 3 times in the game. The highlight of the game came when the Admirals were awarded a penalty shot in the 2nd period. Seattle's Christian Jorve faced

off against Kent's Aaron Mathews, with Mathews playing the Seattle shooter perfectly and slamming the door on him. The Kent parents erupted with cheers as the Seattle team ended up with zilch for the shot. As this was Aaron's first ever penalty shot and save, Coach Pizzey gave Aaron the puck after the game. This was by far the most exciting of the 4 games played, but it did get out of hand with some cheap shots and bad or missed calls by the referees. Final score: Seattle 8, Kent 1. Shots on goal were 64 (including 1 penalty shot) for Seattle, Kent had 6. Kent had 12 penalties for 24 minutes, while Seattle had 6 for 12.

Game 4 had Kent against Whatcom and paled in comparison to game 3 for excitement, but was probably the Storm's best overall effort. It was a relatively clean game, with 16 total minutes of penalties, and the Storm managed 24 shots on Whatcom to their 35 on Kent. Whatcom scored a goal in each period, while Kent was shut out but had some good scoring opportunities. The final score was Whatcom 3, Kent 0.

Case and point; the game with the Portland High School Selects at Kent Valley Ice Centre back on February 22nd.
